
Summer commencement to be held virtually

What is HEERF III, and who is eligible?

Certain students who were enrolled at UAB in fall 2021 or spring and summer 2021 and experienced financial hardships due to COVID-19, including loss of income, increased childcare or medical expenses, inability to pay outstanding balances, emergent needs for new technology and more, can apply online for the newest round of Higher Education Emergency Relief funding (HEERF). UAB will pay approved HEERF-III student emergency grants directly to eligible students.
