

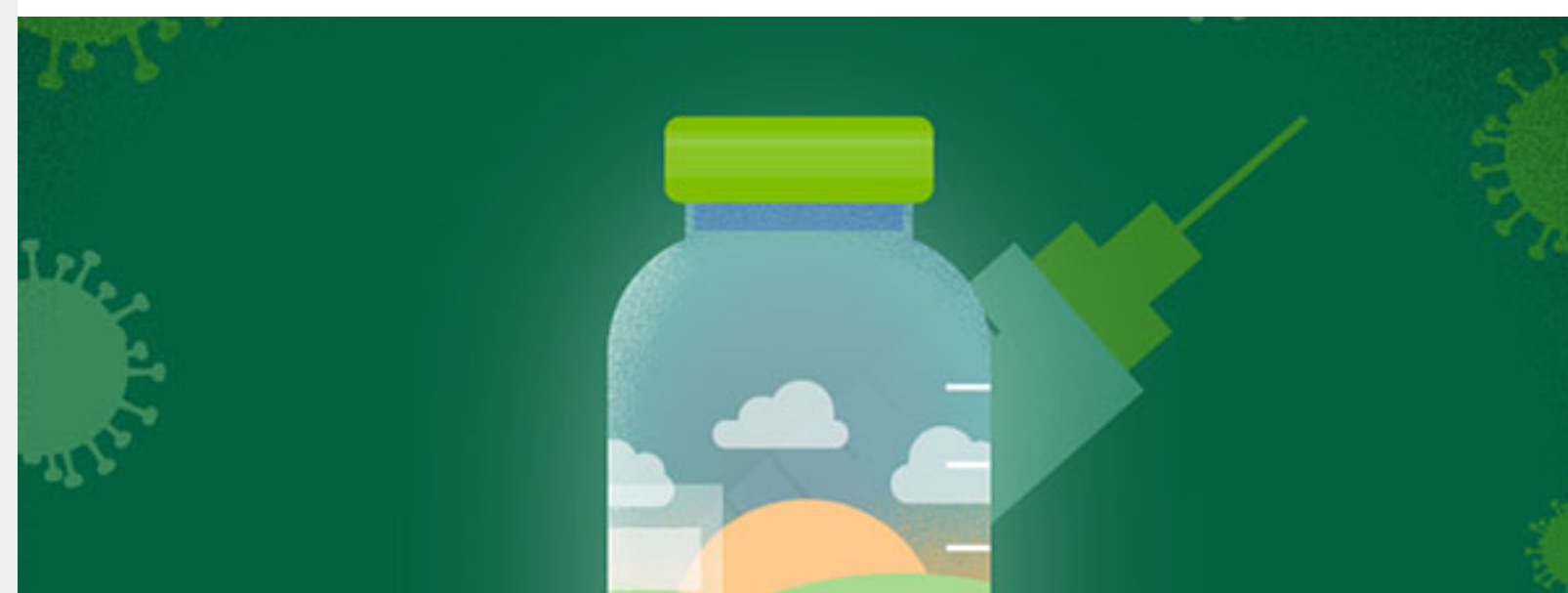

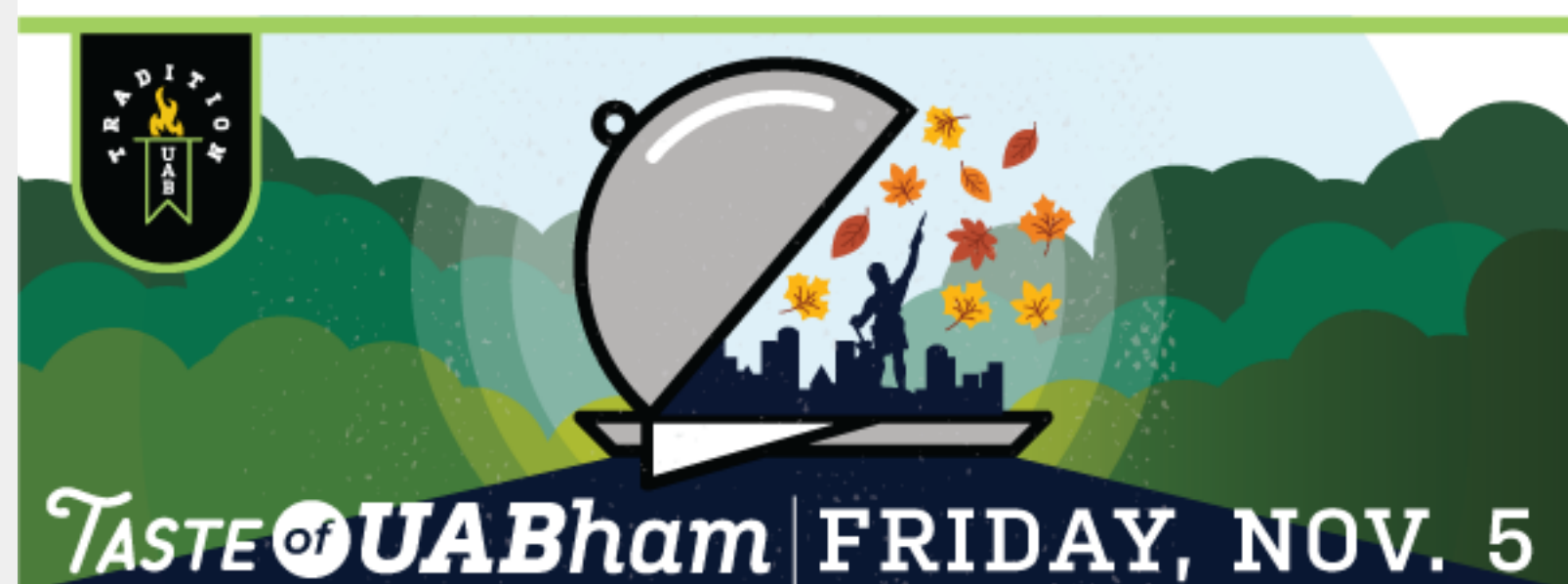
Discuss diversity in the classroom Nov. 10
