


Art assignments expand horizons for astronomy students 🗇


This radiologist is helping doctors see through the hype to an Al future


Things to know



Chemistry, Physics faculty awarded more than \$3 million in **Department of Energy grants**

Jonathan Burns, Ph.D., Sergey Mirov, Ph.D., Yogesh Vohra, Ph.D., and Cheng-Chien Chen, Ph.D., each received funding from the U.S. Department of Energy for four projects in the fields of chemistry and physics.

Study links suicide and food insecurity among college students

Assistant Professor Yusen Zhai, Ph.D., and a co-author examined suicide trends and prevalence among U.S. college students during the height of the COVID pandemic. Overall, suicidal thoughts and behaviors were lower over the study period, but they found that students experiencing food insecurity were at elevated risk.

Study shows impact of firearm laws on neighboring states

Published findings from UAB suggest that certain firearm laws in one state were associated with other states' firearm-related deaths. Additionally, permit-to-purchase laws were associated with decreased firearm-related death rates both within a state and nearby states.
