


Use this timesheet during Campus Kronos outage

The Campus UKG Kronos system is experiencing an outage on the timekeeping platform used by nonexempt employees to track the hours worked daily. (UAB Hospital Kronos users are not impacted by this outage). The vendor is working to resolve the outage, caused by a ransomware attack on UKG. All UAB Campus Kronos users will need to continue to use the Campus Kronos Time Correction Form to record hours worked until further notice. An email describing this process was sent to each affected employee, and employees and related organizational timekeepers who follow the process and document work hours should not experience any disruption in pay. The UAB employee data maintained in Campus UKG Kronos contains no sensitive personal information.




