
Robert Centor, M.D., one of the world's leading experts on sore throat and a mentor to generations of medical students, will receive the highest honor presented by the



Learn about the course design process and how to develop assessments and engaging learning activities that align with course and unit learning objectives during this workshop 10:30 a.m. Feb. 11.


#### Haddin forum to examine the effects of second-hand discrimination on the well-being of Black adults
