# University faculty and staff to get an extra holiday



US could reach herd immunity by late spring

By adding the number of people who have tested positive to the number of people vaccinated and those with natural or acquired immunity, scientists estimate we will reach herd immunity in May, says UAB epidemiologist Suzanne Judd, Ph.D. There will be isolated outbreaks, and a strong vaccination campaign will need to continue.




FROM THE EXPERTS: Vaccine


