Dining program to see student-driven changes

Beginning fall semester, the UAB Campus Dining program will implement student-driven policies. The first change is that 50

percent of a student's unused meal plan meals from the fall semester will carry forward automatically to the spring 2012 semester. Another new policy is converting 25 percent of the Dining Dollars funds remaining on student CampusCard accounts to BlazerBucks at the end of the 2011-12 academic year. This will give students opportunities to use these funds at any venue that accepts BlazerBucks.
