<u>Improved system, standardized schedule available spring 2012</u>

In spring 2012, UAB will upgrade its scheduling software and implement a standard course schedule in order to provide students and faculty greater access to "smart" classrooms and help students and advisers better manage curriculum planning. Starting college can kick-start eating disorders, even in young men

The start of college can be one big stressor, marked by anxiety about finances, academics and relationships. It can be enough to push some people at risk of an eating disorder into the throes of the disease, according to Mary Boggiano, Ph.D. a UAB psychologist who specializes in eating disorders. "The stress and new freedom of eating on their own can put some at risk for eating disorders," she says. While eating disorders are most often associated with women, more than 1 million men in the United States have anorexia nervosa or bulimia nervosa, and almost as many men as women are binge-eaters.
